**KUALA LUMPUR:** The first "Jamuhan Teh Malaysia" was held recently at the Australian High Commissioner's residence. The tea party modelled after the Biggest Australian Morning Tea was held to raise funds for the Breast Cancer Welfare Association (BCWA) and National Cancer Society Malaysia (NCSM).

The tea party was officiated by the Australian High Commissioner Penny Williams. This was followed by a session at the Prince Court Medical Centre and National Cancer Society Malaysia.
